Minutes: The minutes from September 2013 meeting were reviewed. It was moved to approve the minutes from September 17, 2013 as distributed.

Site Visit Rpts:

KCKCC: The September 10-11, 2013 site visit report at Kansas City Kansas Community College, ADN Program was reviewed. Site visitors were Anita Mills, MSN, RN, Mary Blubaugh, MSN, RN and Carol Moreland, MSN, RN.

It was moved to accept the site visit report for Kansas City Kansas Community College, ADN Program with recommendations and to reapprove the program for a period consistent with ACEN accreditation.

Motion #2 Hensley/Martin Adopted. Carol Moreland is to research the history of KCKCC ADN's approved number of student admissions and advise them of the approved number of student admissions.

GCCC: The October 8-9, 2013 site visit report at Garden City Community College, PN Program was reviewed. Site visitors were Mary Blubaugh, MSN, RN and David Martin, MS, RN.

It was moved to accept the site visit report for Garden City Community College, PN Program with recommendation and to reapprove the PN program for five years. Motion #3 Mills/Hensley Adopted. Zeller Abstained.

GCCC: The October 8-9, 2013 site visit report at Garden City Community College, ADN Program was reviewed. Site visitors were Mary Blubaugh, MSN, RN and David Martin, MS, RN.

It was moved to accept the site visit report for Garden City Community College, ADN Program with recommendation and to reapprove the ADN program for a period consistent with ACEN accreditation. Motion #4 Hensley/Hober Adopted. Zeller Abstained.

NCKTC: The October 15-16, 2013 site visit report at North Central Kansas Technical College, Hays ADN Program was reviewed. Site visitors were Mary Blubaugh, MSN, RN and Rebecca Claus, MSN, RN.

It was moved to accept the site visit report for North Central Kansas Technical College, Hays ADN Program with recommendations and to reapprove the ADN program for a period consistent with ACEN accreditation. Motion #5 Martin/Zeller Adopted. Hober Abstained.

Rasmussen College: The October 28, 2013, Overland Park Campus and October 30, 2013 Topeka Satellite Campus initial site visit report for Rasmussen College, ADN Program was reviewed.

It was moved to accept the site visit report for Rasmussen College, ADN program in Overland Park and satellite ADN program in Topeka with recommendations, to admit 10 students per quarter (40 total students per year per program), and next site visit to occur at the time of first graduation. Motion #6 Martin/Hober Adopted.

Major Curriculum Change Requests:

WU: Washburn University School of Nursing BSN Program represented by Monica Scheibmeir, PhD, APRN, FAANP requests a change to NU 441 Adult Medical Surgical Nursing-Integrative Seminar (1 credit hour) course

description, course outcome and a change in the use of clock hours that include integration of simulation, laboratory, and seminar experiences.

Rationale for the change: Changes to the course description are intended to clarify that the clinical hours take place in a simulated environment. Changes to the 30 contact hours are designed to provide greater integration of simulation, laboratory, and seminar experiences. Changes to the outcomes were made to increase clarity and measurability.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from the Washburn University School of Nursing BSN Program to change NU 441 Adult Medical Surgical Nursing-Integrative Seminar (1 credit hour) course description, course outcome and a change in the use of clock hours that include integration of simulation, laboratory, and seminar experiences. Motion #7 Mills/Hensley Adopted.

WU: Washburn University School of Nursing BSN Program represented by Monica Scheibmeir, PhD, APRN, FAANP requests to change credit hours for NU 316 Pharmacology with Lab from 3 credit hours (2 credit hours didactic and 1 credit hour lab to 4 credit hours (3 credit hours didactic and 1 credit hour lab).

Rationale for the change: This course was designed to include both didactic content and laboratory content.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from Washburn University School of Nursing BSN Program to change credit hours for NU 316 Pharmacology with Lab from 3 credit hours (2 credit hours didactic and 1 credit hour lab to 4 credit hours (3 credit hours didactic and 1 credit hour lab). Motion #8 Hensley/Zeller Adopted.

WU: Washburn University School of Nursing BSN Program represented by Monica Scheibmeir, PhD, APRN, FAANP requests to change credit hours for NU 450 Leadership Management and Health Policy from 3 credit hours to 2 credit hours.

Rationale for the change: The requested reduction in credit hours better reflects the actual learning time needed to achieve student learning outcomes.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from the Washburn University School of Nursing BSN Program to change credit hours for NU 450 Leadership Management and Health Policy from 3 credit hours to 2 credit hours. Motion #9 Zeller/Mills Adopted.

NCCC: Neosho County Community College ADN Program represented by Pamela Covault, MSN, RN, CNS, CNE and Beverly Roush, RN, CNS requests opportunity to pilot the delivery of NURS 122 Pharmacology for Nursing in the spring semester in sequence with NURS 111 Foundations of Nursing and NURS 121 Nursing Care of the Adult I at the Ottawa site.

Rationale for the change: Pharmacology for Nursing is currently offered in both hybrid and classroom format in an 8 week session during the summer session. Nursing faculty on the Ottawa campus would like to pilot offering the course in the spring 2014 semester with NURS 111 Foundations of Nursing and NURS 121 Nursing Care of the Adult I. The intent would be to work toward scheduling course content in this course in such a way that it would complement instruction in the NURS 111 and NURS 121 courses. This would also allow the course to be taught over a full semester.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from the Neosho County Community College First Level of Bi-Level ADN Program to pilot the delivery of NURS 122 Pharmacology for Nursing in the spring semester in sequence with NURS 111 Foundations of Nursing and NURS 121 Nursing Care of the Adult I at the Ottawa site. Outcome of pilot will be discussed with KSBN Education Specialist to determine continuation of the pilot program for all sites. Motion #10 Hensley/Mills Adopted.

NCCC: Neosho County Community College ADN Program represented by Pamela Covault, MSN, RN, CNS, CNE and Beverly Roush, RN, CNS requests to have the flexibility to determine the delivery method of the courses on the second level of the program.

Rationale for the change: Second level nursing curriculum includes Family Nursing II, Mental Health Nursing, Nursing Care of the Complex Adult, and Clinical Care of the Complex Adult. In the beginning, the majority of students in the hybrid cohorts were bridge students. In more recent years, a greater number of the first level students are moving to second level have requested to go to the hybrid classroom.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from Neosho County Community College Second Level of Bi-Level ADN Program to have the flexibility to determine the delivery method of the courses. Motion #11 Hober/Zeller Adopted.

MNU: MidAmerica Nazarene University BSN Program represented by Susan Larson, PhD, RN and Deborah Highfill, PhD, RN requests to increase the cohort size by 50, allowing for growth in both the ABSN and the TBSN program.

Rationale for the change: MidAmerica Nazarene University's nursing program has experienced significant growth in the past five years.

Anita Mills, MSN, RN voiced concern regarding the impact on other nursing programs when student admission numbers are increased at an existing nursing program. It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from MidAmerica Nazarene University BSN Program to increase the cohort size by 50, allowing for growth in both the ABSN and the TBSN program. Total students admitted to the BSN program per year not to exceed 180. Motion #12 Martin/Zeller Adopted.

MNU: MidAmerica Nazarene University BSN Program represented by Susan Larson, PhD, RN and Deborah Highfill, PhD, RN requests to change the number of semesters of study from six to four semesters.

Rationale for the change: The six semester program this is currently in place at MNU is not transfer friendly.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from MidAmerica Nazarene University Traditional BSN Program to change the number of semesters of study from six to four semesters. Motion #13 Hensley/Martin Adopted.

MNU: MidAmerica Nazarene University BSN Program represented by Susan Larson, PhD, RN and Deborah Highfill, PhD, RN requests to change NURS2183 Fundamentals of Nursing Care from a three to four credit hour course by adding a clinical component.

Rationale for the change: Fundamental nursing skills include the knowledge necessary for a nurse to perform basic duties of obtaining vital statistics, changing bandages, cleaning wounds, bathing patients and performing CPR.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from MidAmerica Nazarene University Traditional BSN Program to change NURS2183 Fundamentals of Nursing Care from a three to four credit hour course by adding a clinical component. Motion #14 Mills/Zeller Adopted.

MNU: MidAmerica Nazarene University BSN Program represented by Susan Larson, PhD, RN and Deborah Highfill, PhD, RN requests to change NURS4283 Mental Health Nursing from a three to a two credit hour course.

Rationale for the change: Mental health clinical should be dissolved as the incorporated in all clinical experiences.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from MidAmerica Nazarene University Traditional BSN Program to change NURS4283 Mental Health Nursing from a three to a two credit hour course. Motion #15 Hober/Hensley Adopted.

MNU: MidAmerica Nazarene University BSN Program represented by Susan Larson, PhD, RN and Deborah Highfill, PhD, RN requests to add a new course NURS3523 Ethics, Quality, and Safety in Nursing.

Rationale for the change: Patient safety and quality of care are important components of nursing. Students need to be able to recognize how to understand and implement their role in promoting safe and quality outcomes for diverse populations.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from MidAmerica Nazarene University Traditional BSN Program to add a new course NURS3523 Ethics, Quality, and Safety in Nursing. Motion #16 Hensley/Hober Adopted.

MNU: MidAmerica Nazarene University BSN Program represented by Susan Larson, PhD, RN and Deborah Highfill, PhD, RN requests to change NURS4285 Nursing Internship from a 5 to a 4 credit-hour course.

Rationale for the change: This will assist the student to progress more efficiently with the learning outcomes, as they will be given more time to reflect on the learning and will not experience any prolonged “down time” between experiences.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from MidAmerica Nazarene University Traditional BSN Program to change NURS4285 Nursing Internship from a 5 to a 4 credit-hour course. Motion #17 Mills/Hensley Adopted.

MNU: MidAmerica Nazarene University BSN Program represented by Susan Larson, PhD, RN and Deborah Highfill, PhD, RN requests to change NURS4212 Senior Seminar: Transition into Nursing Practice from a two to one credit-hour course.

Rationale for the change: Faculty reviewed several TSNB programs and found that portfolio development had been dropped by several successful programs. In checking with different hospital Human Resource personnel around the Kansas City area, it was discovered that several did not ask or even want to see the student’s portfolio.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from MidAmerica Nazarene University Traditional BSN Program to change NURS4212 Senior Seminar: Transition into Nursing Practice from a two to one credit-hour course. Motion #18 Zeller/Mills Adopted.

BMC (Salina): Brown Mackie College, Salina PN Program represented by Linda Henningsen, MSN, MS, RN requests the option to deliver Introduction to Nursing and Nutrition as a blended format or totally on-ground.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from Brown Mackie College, Salina PN Program the option to deliver Introduction to Nursing and Nutrition as a blended format or totally on-ground. Motion #19 Hensley/Martin Adopted.

BMC (KC): Brown Mackie College, Kansas City PN Program represented by Mary Ann Eickhoff, MSN, RN requests the option to deliver Introduction to Nursing and Nutrition as a blended format or wholly on-ground.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from Brown Mackie College, Kansas City PN Program to deliver Introduction to Nursing and Nutrition as a blended format or totally on-ground. Motion #20 Mills/Hober Adopted.

BMC (KC): Brown Mackie College, Kansas City ADN Program represented by Mary Ann Eickhoff, MSN, RN requests to allow the option to deliver LPN Bridge and Issues in Nursing Practice courses as a blended format or totally on ground.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from Brown Mackie College, Kansas City ADN Program to allow the option to deliver LPN Bridge and Issues in Nursing Practice courses as a blended format or totally on ground. Motion #21 Mills/Zeller Adopted.

Missing MCCR from BMC (Salina) ADN Program to allow the option to deliver LPN Bridge and Issues in Nursing Practice courses as a blended format or totally on ground. If the MCCR was received by KSBN and did not get into packet, motion will be taken before the Board tomorrow. If MCCR was not sent by Brown Mackie, MCCR will need to be brought to the March Education Committee.

BMC (Salina): Brown Mackie College, Salina PN and ADN Programs represented by Linda Henningsen, MSN, MS, RN requests to reduce the required clinical hours for NUR1971 Care of Childbearing Family and Children I and NUR2222 Care of Childbearing Family and Children II from 90 to 45.

Rationale for the change: This change more closely aligns the Brown Mackie Curriculum with KSBN Core Curriculum.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from Brown Mackie College, Salina PN and ADN Programs to reduce the required clinical hours for NUR1971 Care of Childbearing Family and Children I and NUR2222 Care of Childbearing Family and Children II from 90 to 45. Motion #22 Mills/Zeller Adopted.

BMC (KC): Brown Mackie College, Kansas City PN and ADN Programs represented by Mary Ann Eickhoff, MSN, RN requests to reduce the required clinical hours for NUR1971 Care of Childbearing Family and Children I and NUR2222 Care of Childbearing Family and Children II from 90 to 45.

Rationale for the change: This change more closely aligns the Brown Mackie Curriculum with KSBN Core Curriculum.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from Brown Mackie College, Kansas City PN and ADN Programs to reduce the required clinical hours for NUR1971 Care of Childbearing Family and Children I and NUR2222 Care of Childbearing Family and Children II from 90 to 45. Motion #23 Martin/Hober Adopted.

Site Visit Schedule: The 2014 Nursing Program Site Visit Schedule was reviewed. Carol Moreland will be emailing committee members for assistance with the site visits.

Sorrina Gonzalez: Sorrina Gonzalez requests the Education Committee to waive the five year limit after graduation on retaking RN NCLEX.

Rationale for the request: Graduated in February, 2008. Currently serving in the United States Army and due to related mobilizations and duty has not been able to take the NCLEX in some time.
