1 AN ACT concerning emergency medical services; amending K.S.A. 2013
2 Supp. 65-6102, 65-6111, 65-6112, 65-6119, 65-6120, 65-6121, 65-
3 6129c, 65-6133, 65-6135 and 65-6144 and repealing the existing
4 sections.

5
6 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

7 Section 1. K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 65-6102 is hereby amended to read as
8 follows: 65-6102. (a) There is hereby established the emergency medical
9 services board. The office of the emergency medical services board shall
10 be located in the city of Topeka, Kansas.

11 (b) The emergency medical services board shall be composed of 15
12 members to be appointed as follows:

13 (1) Eleven members shall be appointed by the governor. Of such
14 members:

15 (A) Three shall be physicians who are actively involved in emergency
16 medical services;

17 (B) two shall be county commissioners of counties making a levy for
18 ambulance service, at least one of whom shall be from a county having a
19 population of less than 15,000;

20 (C) one shall be an instructor-coordinator;

21 (D) one shall be a hospital administrator actively involved in
22 emergency medical services;

23 (E) one shall be a member of a firefighting unit which provides
24 emergency medical service; and

25 (F) three shall be attendants who are actively involved in emergency
26 medical service. At least two classifications of attendants shall be
27 represented. At least one of such members shall be from a volunteer
28 emergency medical service; and

29 (2) four members shall be appointed as follows:

30 (A) One shall be a member of the Kansas senate to be appointed by
31 the president of the senate;

32 (B) one shall be a member of the Kansas senate to be appointed by
33 the minority leader of the senate;

34 (C) one shall be a member of the Kansas house of representatives to
35 be appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives; and

36 (D) one shall be a member of the Kansas house of representatives to

1 be appointed by the minority leader of the house of representatives.

2 All members of the board shall be residents of the state of Kansas.
3 Appointments to the board shall be made with due consideration that
4 representation of the various geographical areas of the state is ensured. The
5 governor may remove any member of the board upon recommendation of
6 the board. Any person appointed to a position on the board shall forfeit
7 such position upon vacating the office or position which qualified such
8 person to be appointed as a member of the board.

9 ~~(c) Of the two additional physician members appointed by the~~
10 ~~governor on and after July 1, 2011, one shall be appointed for a term of~~
11 ~~three years and one shall be appointed for a term of four years. Thereafter,~~
12 Members shall be appointed for terms of four years and until their
13 successors are appointed and qualified. In the case of a vacancy in the
14 membership of the board, the vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired
15 term.

16 (d) The board shall meet at least six times annually and at least once
17 each quarter and at the call of the chairperson or at the request of the
18 ~~administrator~~ *executive director* of the emergency medical services board
19 or of any ~~six~~ *seven* members of the board. At the first meeting of the board
20 after January 1 each year, the members shall elect a chairperson and a
21 vice-chairperson who shall serve for a term of one year. The vice-
22 chairperson shall exercise all of the powers of the chairperson in the
23 absence of the chairperson. If a vacancy occurs in the office of the
24 chairperson or vice-chairperson, the board shall fill such vacancy by
25 election of one of its members to serve the unexpired term of such office.
26 Members of the board attending meetings of the board or attending a
27 subcommittee meeting thereof authorized by the board shall be paid
28 compensation, subsistence allowances, mileage and other expenses as
29 provided in K.S.A. 75-3223, and amendments thereto.

30 (e) Except as otherwise provided by law, all vouchers for
31 expenditures and all payrolls of the emergency medical services board
32 shall be approved by the emergency medical services board or a person
33 designated by the board.

34 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 65-6111 is hereby amended to read as
35 follows: 65-6111. (a) The emergency medical services board shall:

36 (1) Adopt any rules and regulations necessary to carry out the
37 provisions of this act;

38 (2) review and approve the allocation and expenditure of moneys
39 appropriated for emergency medical services;

40 (3) conduct hearings for all regulatory matters concerning ambulance
41 services, attendants, instructor-coordinators, training officers and ~~providers~~
42 ~~of training~~ *sponsoring organizations*;

43 (4) submit a budget to the legislature for the operation of the board;

1 (5) develop a state plan for the delivery of emergency medical
2 services;

3 (6) enter into contracts as may be necessary to carry out the duties
4 and functions of the board under this act;

5 (7) review and approve all requests for state and federal funding
6 involving emergency medical services projects in the state or delegate such
7 duties to the ~~administrator~~ *executive director*;

8 (8) approve all training programs for attendants, instructor-
9 coordinators and training officers and prescribe certification application
10 fees by rules and regulations;

11 (9) approve methods of examination for certification of attendants,
12 training officers and instructor-coordinators and prescribe examination
13 fees by rules and regulations;

14 (10) appoint a medical advisory council of not less than six members,
15 including ~~two~~ *one* board ~~members~~, ~~one of whom~~ *member who* shall be a
16 physician and not less than ~~four~~ *five* other physicians who are active and
17 knowledgeable in the field of emergency medical services who are not
18 members of the board to advise and assist the board in medical standards
19 and practices as determined by the board. The medical advisory council
20 shall elect a chairperson from among its membership and shall meet upon
21 the call of the chairperson; and

22 (11) approve ~~providers of training~~ *sponsoring organizations* by
23 prescribing standards and requirements by rules and regulations and
24 withdraw or modify such approval in accordance with the Kansas
25 administrative procedures act and the rules and regulations of the board.

26 (b) The emergency medical services board may grant a temporary
27 variance from an identified rule or regulation when a literal application or
28 enforcement of the rule or regulation would result in serious hardship and
29 the relief granted would not result in any unreasonable risk to the public
30 interest, safety or welfare.

31 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 65-6112 is hereby amended to read as
32 follows: 65-6112. As used in this act:

33 (a) "Administrator" means the executive director of the emergency
34 medical services board.

35 (b) "Advanced emergency medical technician" means a person who
36 holds an advanced emergency medical technician certificate issued
37 pursuant to this act.

38 (c) "Advanced practice registered nurse" means an advanced practice
39 registered nurse as defined in K.S.A. 65-1113, and amendments thereto.

40 (d) "Ambulance" means any privately or publicly owned motor
41 vehicle, airplane or helicopter designed, constructed, prepared, staffed and
42 equipped for use in transporting and providing emergency care for
43 individuals who are ill or injured.

1 (e) "Ambulance service" means any organization operated for the
2 purpose of transporting sick or injured persons to or from a place where
3 medical care is furnished, whether or not such persons may be in need of
4 emergency or medical care in transit.

5 (f) "Attendant" means a first responder, an emergency medical
6 responder, emergency medical technician, emergency medical technician-
7 intermediate, emergency medical technician-defibrillator, emergency
8 medical technician-intermediate/defibrillator, advanced emergency
9 medical technician, ~~mobile intensive care technician~~ or paramedic certified
10 pursuant to this act.

11 (g) "Board" means the emergency medical services board established
12 pursuant to K.S.A. 65-6102, and amendments thereto.

13 (h) "Emergency medical service" means the effective and coordinated
14 delivery of such care as may be required by an emergency which includes
15 the care and transportation of individuals by ambulance services and the
16 performance of authorized emergency care by a physician, advanced
17 practice registered nurse, professional nurse, a licensed physician assistant
18 or attendant.

19 (i) "Emergency medical technician" means a person who holds an
20 emergency medical technician certificate issued pursuant to this act.

21 (j) "Emergency medical technician-defibrillator" means a person who
22 holds an emergency medical technician-defibrillator certificate issued
23 pursuant to this act.

24 (k) "Emergency medical technician-intermediate" means a person
25 who holds an emergency medical technician-intermediate certificate issued
26 pursuant to this act.

27 (l) "Emergency medical technician-intermediate/defibrillator" means
28 a person who holds both an emergency medical technician-intermediate
29 and emergency medical technician-defibrillator certificate issued pursuant
30 to this act.

31 (m) "Emergency medical responder" means a person who holds an
32 emergency medical responder certificate issued pursuant to this act.

33 (n) "First responder" means a person who holds a first responder
34 certificate issued pursuant to this act.

35 (o) "Hospital" means a hospital as defined by K.S.A. 65-425, and
36 amendments thereto.

37 (p) "Instructor-coordinator" means a person who is certified under
38 this act to teach, *coordinate*, or *both*, initial certification and continuing
39 education classes.

40 (q) "Medical director" means a physician:

41 (1) *Appointed by the operator of an ambulance service who holds a*
42 *permit to operate the ambulance service in this state who provides medical*
43 *direction, leadership, oversight and quality assurance to ensure that*

1 *effective emergency medical care is provided to out-of-hospital patients by*
2 *attendants functioning under the service permit. The medical director*
3 *implements protocols for treatment and supports the attendants through*
4 *training and competency validation; or*

5 *(2) identified by a sponsoring organization of an emergency medical*
6 *services education program who reviews and approves the educational*
7 *content of the program curriculum to certify its ongoing appropriateness*
8 *and medical accuracy, reviews the quality of medical instruction,*
9 *supervision and evaluation of the students.*

10 (r) "Medical protocols" mean written guidelines which authorize
11 attendants to perform certain medical procedures prior to contacting a
12 physician, physician assistant authorized by a physician, advanced practice
13 registered nurse authorized by a physician or professional nurse authorized
14 by a physician. The medical protocols shall be approved by a county
15 medical society or the medical staff of a hospital to which the ambulance
16 service primarily transports patients, or if neither of the above are able or
17 available to approve the medical protocols, then the medical protocols
18 shall be submitted to the medical advisory council for approval.

19 ~~(s) "Mobile intensive care technician" means a person who holds a~~
20 ~~mobile intensive care technician certificate issued pursuant to this act.~~

21 (t) "Municipality" means any city, county, township, fire district or
22 ambulance service district.

23 (u) "Nonemergency transportation" means the care and transport of
24 a sick or injured person under a foreseen combination of circumstances
25 calling for continuing care of such person. As used in this subsection,
26 transportation includes performance of the authorized level of services of
27 the attendant whether within or outside the vehicle as part of such
28 transportation services.

29 (v) "Operator" means a person or municipality who has a permit to
30 operate an ambulance service in the state of Kansas.

31 (w) "Paramedic" means a person who holds a paramedic certificate
32 issued pursuant to this act.

33 (x) "Person" means an individual, a partnership, an association, a
34 joint-stock company or a corporation.

35 (y) "Physician" means a person licensed by the state board of
36 healing arts to practice medicine and surgery.

37 ~~(z) "Physician assistant" means a person who is licensed under the~~
38 ~~physician assistant licensure act and who is acting under the direction of a~~
39 ~~responsible physician assistant as defined in K.S.A. 65-28a02, and~~
40 ~~amendments thereto.~~

41 ~~(aa) "Professional nurse" means a licensed professional nurse as~~
42 ~~defined by K.S.A. 65-1113, and amendments thereto.~~

43 ~~(bb) "Provider of training" means a corporation, partnership,~~

1 ~~accredited postsecondary education institution, ambulance service, fire~~
 2 ~~department, hospital or municipality that conducts training programs that~~
 3 ~~include, but are not limited to, initial courses of instruction and continuing~~
 4 ~~education for attendants, instructor-coordinators or training officers~~

5 (aa) "Sponsoring organization" means any professional association,
 6 accredited postsecondary educational institution, ambulance service
 7 which holds a permit to operate in this state, fire department, other
 8 officially organized public safety agency, hospital, corporation,
 9 governmental entity or emergency medical services regional council, as
 10 approved by the executive director, to offer initial courses of instruction or
 11 continuing education programs.

12 ~~(ee) "Responsible physician" means responsible physician as such~~
 13 ~~term is defined under K.S.A. 65-28a02, and amendments thereto.~~

14 ~~(dd) (bb) "Training officer" means a person who is certified pursuant~~
 15 ~~to this act to teach; or coordinate, or both, initial courses of instruction for~~
 16 ~~first responders or emergency medical responders and continuing~~
 17 ~~education as prescribed by the board.~~

18 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 65-6119 is hereby amended to read as
 19 follows: 65-6119. ~~(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, mobile~~
 20 ~~intensive care technicians may:~~

21 ~~(1) Perform all the authorized activities identified in K.S.A. 65-6120,~~
 22 ~~65-6121, 65-6123, 65-6144, and amendments thereto;~~

23 ~~(2) when voice contact or a telemetered electrocardiogram is~~
 24 ~~monitored by a physician, physician assistant where authorized by a~~
 25 ~~physician, an advanced practice registered nurse where authorized by a~~
 26 ~~physician or licensed professional nurse where authorized by a physician~~

1 that a mobile intensive care technician has to apply for renewal of a
2 certificate following the effective date of this act.

3 ~~(d) Upon transition notwithstanding any other provision of law, a~~
4 paramedic may:

22 follows: 65-6120. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
23 contrary, an emergency medical technician-intermediate may:

24 (1) Perform any of the activities identified by K.S.A. 65-6121(a), and
25 amendments thereto;

26 (2) when approved by medical protocols or where voice contact by
27 radio or telephone is monitored by a physician, physician assistant where
28 authorized by a physician, advanced practice registered nurse where
29 authorized by a physician or licensed professional nurse where authorized
30 by a physician, and direct communication is maintained, upon order of
31 such person, may perform veni-puncture for the purpose of blood sampling
32 collection and initiation and maintenance of intravenous infusion of saline
33 solutions, dextrose and water solutions or ringers lactate IV solutions,
34 endotracheal intubation and administration of nebulized albuterol;

35 (3) perform, during an emergency, those activities specified in
36 subsection (a)(2) before contacting the persons identified in subsection (a)
37 (2) when specifically authorized to perform such activities by medical

4 Alternatively, upon application for renewal, such individual shall be
5 deemed to hold a certificate as an advanced emergency medical technician

22 emergency medical technician or an emergency medical responder,
23 depending on the transition course that was successfully completed.
24 Alternatively, upon application for renewal of an emergency medical
25 technician-intermediate certificate, the applicant shall be renewed as an
26 emergency medical technician or an emergency medical responder,
27 depending on the transition course that was successfully completed. Such
28 individual shall not be required to file an original application for
29 certification as an emergency medical technician or emergency medical
30 responder.

31 (e) Failure to successfully complete either an advanced emergency
32 medical technician transition course, an emergency medical technician
33 transition course or emergency medical responder transition course will
34 result in loss of certification.

35 (f) Upon transition, notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
36 contrary, an advanced emergency medical technician may:

37 (1) Perform any of the activities identified by K.S.A. 65-6121(f), and
38 amendments thereto; and

39 (2) perform any of the following interventions, by use of the devices,
40 medications and equipment, or any combination thereof, as specifically
41 identified in rules and regulations, after successfully completing an
42 approved course of instruction, local specialized device training and
43 competency validation and when authorized by medical protocols, or upon

1 order when direct communication is maintained by radio, telephone or
2 video conference with a physician, physician assistant where authorized by
3 a physician, an advanced practice registered nurse where authorized by a
4 physician, or licensed professional nurse where authorized by a physician

18 (g) An individual who holds a valid certificate as both an emergency
19 medical technician-intermediate and as an emergency medical technician-
20 defibrillator once successfully completing the board prescribed transition
21 course, and validation of cognitive and psychomotor competency as
22 determined by rules and regulations of the board, may apply to transition
23 to an advanced emergency medical technician. Alternatively, upon
24 application for renewal, such individual shall be deemed to hold a
25 certificate as an advanced emergency medical technician under this act,
26 provided such individual has completed all continuing education hour
27 requirements inclusive of successful completion of a transition course, and
28 such individual shall not be required to file an original application for
29 certification as an advanced emergency medical technician under this act.

30 (h) "Renewal" as used in subsection (g), refers to the first or second
31 opportunity after December 31, 2011, that an emergency medical
32 technician-intermediate and emergency medical technician-defibrillator
33 has to apply for renewal of a certificate.

34 (i) An individual who holds both an emergency medical technician-
35 intermediate certificate and an emergency medical technician-defibrillator
36 certificate, who fails to meet the transition requirements as specified may
37 complete either the board prescribed emergency medical technician
38 transition course or emergency medical responder transition course, and
39 provide validation of cognitive and psychomotor competency and all
40 continuing education hour requirements inclusive of successful completion
41 of a transition course as determined by rules and regulations of the board.
42 Upon completion, such individual may apply to transition to become an
43 emergency medical technician or emergency medical responder, depending

1 on the transition course that was successfully completed. Alternatively,
2 upon application for renewal of an emergency medical technician-
3 intermediate certificate and an emergency medical technician-defibrillator
4 certificate, the applicant shall be renewed as an emergency medical
5 technician or an emergency medical responder, depending on the transition
6 course that was successfully completed. Such individual shall not be
7 required to file an original application for certification as an emergency
8 medical technician or emergency medical responder.

9 (j) Failure to successfully complete either the advanced emergency
10 medical technician transition requirements, an emergency medical
11 technician transition course or the emergency medical responder transition
12 course will result in loss of certification.

13 Sec. 6. K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 65-6121 is hereby amended to read as
14 follows: 65-6121. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
15 contrary, an emergency medical technician may perform any of the
16 following activities:

- 17 (1) Patient assessment and vital signs;
- 18 (2) airway maintenance including the use of:
 - 19 (A) Oropharyngeal and nasopharyngeal airways;
 - 20 (B) esophageal obturator airways with or without gastric suction
21 device;
 - 22 (C) multi-lumen airway; and
 - 23 (D) oxygen demand valves.
- 24 (3) Oxygen therapy;
- 25 (4) oropharyngeal suctioning;
- 26 (5) cardiopulmonary resuscitation procedures;
- 27 (6) control accessible bleeding;
- 28 (7) apply pneumatic anti-shock garment;
- 29 (8) manage outpatient medical emergencies;
- 30 (9) extricate patients and utilize lifting and moving techniques;
- 31 (10) manage musculoskeletal and soft tissue injuries including
32 dressing and bandaging wounds or the splinting of fractures, dislocations,
33 sprains or strains;
- 34 (11) use of backboards to immobilize the spine;
- 35 (12) administer activated charcoal and glucose;
- 36 (13) monitor intravenous line delivering intravenous fluids during
37 interfacility transport with the following restrictions:
 - 38 (A) The physician approves the transfer by an emergency medical
39 technician;
 - 40 (B) no medications or nutrients have been added to the intravenous
41 fluids; and
 - 42 (C) the emergency medical technician may monitor, maintain and
43 shut off the flow of intravenous fluid;

2 (15) administer epinephrine auto-injectors provided that:

3 (A) The emergency medical technician successfully completes a
4 course of instruction approved by the board in the administration of
5 epinephrine;

6 (B) the emergency medical technician serves with an ambulance
7 service or a first response organization that provides emergency medical
8 services; and

9 (C) the emergency medical technician is acting pursuant to medical
10 protocols;

11 (16) perform, during nonemergency transportation, those activities
12 specified in this section when specifically authorized to perform such
13 activities by medical protocols; or

14 (17) when authorized by medical protocol, assist the patient in the
15 administration of the following medications which have been prescribed
16 for that patient: Auto-injection epinephrine, sublingual nitroglycerin and
17 inhalers for asthma and emphysema.

18 (b) An individual who holds a valid certificate as an emergency
19 medical technician at the current basic level once successfully completing
20 the board prescribed transition course, and validation of cognitive and
21 psychomotor competency as determined by rules and regulations of the
22 board, may apply to transition to become an emergency medical
23 technician. Alternatively, upon application for renewal, such individual
24 shall be deemed to hold a certificate as an emergency medical technician
25 under this act, provided such individual has completed all continuing
26 education hour requirements inclusive of successful completion of a
27 transition course, and such individual shall not be required to file an
28 original application for certification as an emergency medical technician.
