Review onsite packet:

Add/Rev. Agenda: Massage Therapist licensing added under new business.

Unfinished Business

IV Therapy checklist: Corrections to the checklist were discussed and will be brought back at the September committee meeting.

IV Therapy final regulations: The IV therapy regulations were approved and are now on our web page.

IV Therapy program issues: Some students are starting classes without being licensed. It was consensus of the committee to send a letter to the PN educators to inform students that they cannot sign up for an IV therapy class until they have been licensed.

Update on Osawatomie State Hospital LMHT progress:

Osawatomie State Hospital is in the process of writing a curriculum for a Mental Health Technician program and has been to KSBN to have Carol Moreland the Education Specialist review the information. They are considering creating a refresher course and are also looking at creating a bridge program for current CNA's, CMA's and MHT's to become LMHT's. The statutes for Licensed Mental Health Technicians do not have regulations that speak to refresher course content.

New Business

EMS proposed changes:

Proposed changes to statutes and regulations for BEMS and RN's on ambulances and qualifications were reviewed. The committee had no suggested changes for BEMS.

Massage Therapist:

HB 2564 would license Massage Therapists but died in committee last year. Several legislators suggested that the Board of Nursing was the best fit for the massage therapist to be placed with. A discussion was held about how many other states license massage therapist, their education, inspections and mobile practice. It was consensus of the committee to have a massage therapy representative come to the September committee meeting to give presentation.
