On March 26, 2014, the Kansas Board of Nursing (KSBN) requested additional data from Rasmussen College on the application for an Associate Degree in Nursing (hereinafter “ADN”) at the Topeka and Overland Park, Kansas campuses. The documents describe the College’s Clinical Site Learning Objectives Matrix, prepared in conjunction with staff members of the Board of Nursing. It is the intent of this matrix to set forth in a single document those clinical experiences that students attending one of the two Rasmussen College ADN programs can expect to receive as a part of their degree completion. The matrix sets forth each clinical experience by course number, clinical site, and campus to which it applies. The College believes that this matrix responds to the request made at the most recent KSBN meeting, and that it has fully responded to all other statutory and regulatory requirements pertaining to ADN program approval. Rasmussen College looks forward to receiving the KSBN’s final approval to begin enrolling students at both locations for the term beginning on July 1, 2014. Rasmussen College has attached to this letter proposed language for the KSBN to consider as a motion documenting such approval.

The College began the process of obtaining KSBN approval on July 15, 2013, when the first application for approval of ADN programs in Overland Park and Topeka was submitted. At this time, the College requested that each campus be permitted to enroll up to 18 students per term. On September 17, 2013, the KSBN’s Education Committee approved this request contingent upon a site visit of both campuses prior to admission of students. On September 18, 2013, the KSBN unanimously concurred with the Education Committee’s recommendation, and approved Rasmussen College’s request for approval, also contingent upon site visits.

On October 28, 2013 and October 30, 2013, representatives of the KSBN conducted site visits of each of the two campuses. Site visit documents reflect that these KSBN representatives interviewed more than 30 individuals (both Rasmussen College employees and representatives of clinical sites identified by and committed to the College’s ADN programs) as a part of their review work. The representatives created a check list of items that Rasmussen College should provide as a part of its file, and concluded with a “recommendation of initial approval of an ADN program in Overland Park and satellite ADN program in Topeka with site visit to occur after first graduation of students.”

On December 11, 2013, the Education Committee agreed unanimously to accept the site visit for each of the Overland Park and Topeka ADN programs, and to approve Rasmussen College as a nursing school authorized to admit up to 10 students per term at each campus. On December 11, 2013, the KSBN took the unprecedented step of rejecting the unanimous recommendation of its Education Committee and

denied Rasmussen College's application. With this denial, the KSBN made additional requests including: (a) copies of signed clinical agreements for additional clinical sites, especially acute pediatric sites; (b) information from additional clinical sites (number of students, days/times, clinical experiences available to students, staff available, and clinical schedules); and (c) contact info for additional clinical sites. The KSBN confirmed these requests in a December 13, 2013 letter from Carol Moreland to the College.

On February 20, 2014, Rasmussen College provided the additional information requested in the December 13, 2013 letter, including additional clinical sites (with signed clinical agreements) committed to the College's ADN programs at both the Overland Park and Topeka campuses. KSBN staff reported at the March 26, 2014 KSBN meeting that confirmatory calls had been made by staff to each of the additional clinical sites and that the College's February 20, 2014 submission did respond to the KSBN requests made in its December 13, 2013 letter. At this point, the College has clinical site commitments sufficient for more than its initial request for 18 students per term per campus.

Notwithstanding the College's response, the KSBN initially considered the outright denial of Rasmussen College's application seemingly based upon concerns as to whether a need existed to enroll any additional students in an ADN program in Kansas. The only evidence on this issue in the record is contained in Rasmussen College's initial application, which provides evidence directly contrary to this concern, and displays an ever-increasing need for ADN programs (assuming that sufficient clinical opportunities can be found). Ultimately, the KSBN agreed to allow a "total of 10 students" contingent upon receiving yet more information from Rasmussen College regarding "clinical experiences" to be obtained at each of the committed clinical sites.

Rasmussen College appreciates the role of the KSBN in ensuring that educational programs offered to nursing students meet statutory and regulatory requirements and produce well-qualified nurses to serve the health care needs of the state. The College believes that it has demonstrated in its submissions to the KSBN that its nursing programs have the necessary rigor to accomplish these goals. Just as Rasmussen College appreciates the sacrifices made by individuals to serve as KSBN members to assist it in fulfilling its given role, the College hopes that the KSBN appreciates the financial commitments and time required to reach this point in the application process. Rasmussen College now asks that the KSBN consider the evidential record in this application and approve the application for an ADN program in Overland Park and a satellite ADN program in Topeka. The College believes that the evidential record supports the initial request for 18 students per term, per campus, and asks that the KSBN's motion reflect those numbers. Alternatively, Rasmussen is prepared to accept the Education Committee's recommendation of 10 students per term, per campus as an initial limitation, without prejudice to making requests for increased enrollment as the programs mature.
