Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Jeanne Walsh, RN, MSN, Chair, at 8:40 a.m. in Room 509 of the Landon State Office Building.

Add./Rev. Agenda: Addition to agenda: Item I. Process for ADN & BSN graduates to take PN NCLEX within 2 years of graduation.

Announcements: Jeanne Walsh, RN, MSN presented Wanda Bonnel, PhD, RN with a certificate of appreciation for her time served on the Education Committee.

Minutes: The minutes from June 2013 meeting were reviewed. It was moved to approve the minutes from June 11, 2013 as distributed. Motion #1 Hensley/Martin Adopted.

Site Visit Rpts:

ITT/Wichita: The July 9-10, 2013 site visit report at Breckenridge School of Nursing at ITT Technical Institute, Wichita, ADN Program was reviewed. Site visitors were Anita Mills, MSN, RN and Carol Moreland, MSN, RN.

It was moved to accept the site visit report for Breckenridge School of Nursing at ITT Technical Institute, Wichita, ADN Program with

recommendations and to reapprove the program for five years. Motion #2 Bonnel/Catanzaro Adopted.

Major Curriculum Change Requests:

Univ. of KS SON: University of Kansas School of Nursing Graduate Program represented by Cynthia Teel, RN, PhD, FAAN requests to expand NRSNG 844 Advanced Psychiatric Assessment from 2 to 3 credits to incorporate more depth in assessment of dangerous behaviors, crisis intervention, epidemiology and genetic risks for psychiatric disorders. This course is also a part of the BSN-DNP curriculum.

Rationale for the change: To allow more focused learning time on the more current methods and techniques for a collaborative, self-motivating role in their education.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from the University of Kansas School of Nursing, Graduate Program to expand NRSNG 844 Advanced Psychiatric Assessment from 2 to 3 credits to incorporate more depth in assessment of dangerous behaviors, crisis intervention, epidemiology and genetic risks for psychiatric disorders. This course is also a part of the BSN-DNP curriculum. Motion #3 Mills/Catanzaro Adopted. Martin and Bonnel Abstained.

Univ. of KS SON: University of Kansas School of Nursing Graduate Program represented by Cynthia Teel, RN, PhD, FAAN requests for course NRSNG 849 Psychotherapeutics III; Practicum. This course has been changed to correspond with the revisions to the Scope and Standards of Psychiatric Mental Health Nursing. The credit hours have been changed from 3-5 to 3-4. This course is also a part of the BSN-DNP curriculum.

Rationale for the change: To allow more focused learning time on the more current methods and techniques for a collaborative, self-motivating role in their education.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from the University of Kansas School of Nursing, Graduate Program for course NRSNG 849 Psychotherapeutics III; Practicum. This course has been changed to correspond with the revisions to the Scope and Standards of Psychiatric Mental Health Nursing. The credit hours have been changed from 3-5 to 3-4. This course is also a part of the BSN-DNP curriculum. Motion #4 Catanzaro/Hensley Adopted. Martin and Bonnel Abstained.

Univ. of KS SON: University of Kansas School of Nursing Graduate Program represented by Cynthia Teel, RN, PhD, FAAN requests to revise the Master's Program Objectives to more closely align with the new (2011) AACN Essentials of

Master's Education in Nursing, and the limitation to a Leadership-only major for the KU Master's nursing program, effective with Spring 2013 admissions.

Rationale for the change: To allow more focused learning time on the more current methods and techniques for a collaborative, self-motivating role in their education.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from the University of Kansas School of Nursing, Graduate Program to revise the Master's Program Objectives to more closely align with the new (2011) AACN Essentials of Master's Education in Nursing, and the limitation to a Leadership-only major for the KU Master's nursing program, effective with Spring 2013 admissions. Motion #5 Hensley/Mills Adopted. Martin and Bonnel Abstained.

Univ. of KS SON: University of Kansas School of Nursing Graduate Program represented by Cynthia Teel, RN, PhD, FAAN requests to change NRSRG 862 Adult/Gerontological Healthcare I to more closely reflect competencies as well as the course sequence. The course has been non-sequential. The revisions change the course to sequential and it will be taught online with NRSRG 865. This course is also a part of the BSN-DNP curriculum.

Rationale for the change: To allow more focused learning time on the more current methods and techniques for a collaborative, self-motivating role in their education.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from the University of Kansas School of Nursing, Graduate Program to change NRSRG 862 Adult/Gerontological Healthcare I to more closely reflect competencies as well as the course sequence. The course has been non-sequential. The revisions change the course to sequential and it will be taught online with NRSRG 865. This course is also a part of the BSN-DNP curriculum. Motion #6 Mills/Catanzaro Adopted. Martin and Bonnel Abstained.

Univ. of KS SON: University of Kansas School of Nursing Graduate Program represented by Cynthia Teel, RN, PhD, FAAN requests to add NRSRG 911 Tools for Practice Doctoral Scholarship (3). This course was developed to better meet students' needs for doctoral-level methods of inquiry. Couples with NRSRG 804, the course provides a more in-depth discussion of inquiry techniques. Additionally the course is designed so that it is open to enrollment for students from other practice doctorate programs. This course is also a part of the BSN-DNP curriculum.

Rationale for the change: To allow more focused learning time on the more current methods and techniques for a collaborative, self-motivating role in their education.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from the University of Kansas School of Nursing, Graduate Program to add NRSG 911 Tools for Practice Doctoral Scholarship (3). This course was developed to better meet students' needs for doctoral-level methods of inquiry. Coupled with NRSG 804, the course provides a more in-depth discussion of inquiry techniques. Additionally the course is designed so that it is open to enrollment for students from other practice doctorate programs. This course is also a part of the BSN-DNP curriculum. Motion #7 Catanzaro/Mills Adopted. Martin and Bonnel Abstained.

KCPNE:

KCPNE PN Core Curriculum represented by Sandy Pangburn, RN, MSN and Gail Withers, DNP, RN requests to move all KSPN Clinical Courses to Support Courses to allow a variation in total number of credit hours with the understanding that all PN Programs must maintain a minimum of 45 total credit hours for Level C certificate. KSPN Foundations of Nursing Clinical 1-2 credit hours, KSPN Medical Surgical Nursing I Clinical 1-3 credit hours, KSPN Medical Surgical Nursing II Clinical 1-3 credit hours, KSPN Maternal Child Nursing Clinical to remain at 1 credit hour. This will allow individual programs more flexibility.

Rationale for the change: KBOR reports all programs must be at same certificate level, which includes both core and pre-req hours,

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from KCPNE for KSPN Core Curriculum to move all KSPN Clinical Courses to Support Courses to allow a variation in total number of credit hours with the understanding that all PN Programs must maintain a minimum of 45 total credit hours for Level C certificate. KSPN Foundations of Nursing Clinical 1-2 credit hours, KSPN Medical Surgical Nursing I Clinical 1-3 credit hours, KSPN Medical Surgical Nursing II Clinical 1-3 credit hours, KSPN Maternal Child Nursing Clinical to remain at 1 credit hour. This will allow individual programs more flexibility. Motion #8 Martin/Catanzaro Adopted.

Coffeyville CC:

Coffeyville Community College ADN Program represented by Heather Pollet, MS, RN requests to add NSRN-210 Mental Health Nursing II Course (2 credit hours) to the 3rd semester of the program to begin January 2014.

Rationale for the change: This change would allow for adequate time to cover the advanced concepts in mental health in a course designed for the RN level.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from Coffeyville Community College ADN Program to add NSRN-210 Mental Health Nursing II Course (2 credit hours) to the 3rd semester of the program to begin January 2014. Motion #9 Mills/Martin Adopted.

Coffeyville CC: Coffeyville Community College ADN Program represented by Heather Pollet, MS, RN requests to decrease the credit hours for NSRN 225 Maternal Child Nursing II clinical from three (3) to two (2) credits and increase the NSRN 220 Maternal Child Nursing II theory from two (2) to three (3) credits.

Rationale for the change: This new change would allow for more time to cover the pediatric disorders in addition to the maternal/newborn aspects of the course.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from Coffeyville Community College ADN Program to decrease the credit hours for NSRN 225 Maternal Child Nursing II clinical from three (3) to two (2) credits and increase the NSRN 220 Maternal Child Nursing II theory from two (2) to three (3) credits. Motion #10 Martin/Catanzaro Adopted.

Coffeyville CC: Coffeyville Community College ADN Program represented by Heather Pollet, MS, RN requests to add to (2) credit hours to NSRN 240 Advanced Nursing Course changing from four (4) to six (6) credit hours.

Rationale for the change: This change would allow a more realistic amount of time to cover the complex disease processes in this course.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from Coffeyville Community College ADN Program to add to (2) credit hours to NSRN 240 Advanced Nursing Course changing from four (4) to six (6) credit hours. Motion #11 Hensley/Bonnel Adopted.

Coffeyville CC: Coffeyville Community College ADN Program represented by Heather Pollet, MS, RN requests to add NSRN 250 NCLEX-RN Review Course (1 credit hour) to the 4th semester of the program.

Rationale for the change: This change will help prep the students for NCLEX-RN by covering challenging topics known to the NCLEX-RN.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from Coffeyville Community College ADN Program to add NSRN 250 NCLEX-RN Review Course (1 credit hour) to the 4th semester of the program. Motion #12 Bonnel/Catanzaro Adopted.

Donnelly College: Donnelly College PN Program represented by Maureen Wiederholt, RN, BSN, MSTE and Kerry Bledsoe, RN to add to each core course (NU 100 Foundations, NU 102 Medical Surgical I and NU 200 Medical Surgical II) a clinical lab course for Lab checkoff/competency and Sims Training. This will be 2 credit hours for each course. Changing the program from 30 to 36 credits. With the prerequisites classes this makes a total of 44 credits.

Rationale for the change: The extra lab time will assist in critical thinking skills. Lab time and clinical time will be clearly defined.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from Donnelly College PN Program to add to each core course (NU 100 Foundations, NU 102 Medical Surgical I and NU 200 Medical Surgical II) a clinical lab course for Lab checkoff/competency and Sims Training. This will be 2 credit hours for each course. Changing the program from 30 to 36 credits. With the prerequisites classes this makes a total of 44 credits with clarification of clinical hours via letter to the Board by December 1, 2013. Motion #13 Bonnel/Catanzaro Adopted.

Donnelly College: Donnelly College PN Program represented by Maureen Wiederholt, RN, BSN, MSTE and Kerry Bledsoe, RN for an increase of 5 students to re-enter the program because of failure in 1 course. This will not increase the number of admittance slots (25) but will allow a student who failed a class to re-enter while maintaining an acceptable number in the program, staying in rotation and keeping within a 2 year framework of training.

Rationale for the change: To allow students who failed a class to re-enter while staying in rotation and keeping within a 2 year framework of training.

It was moved to accept the Major Curriculum Change Request from Donnelly College PN Program for an increase of 5 students to re-enter the program because of failure in 1 course. This will not increase the number of admittance slots (25) but will allow a student who failed a class to re-enter while maintaining an acceptable number in the program, staying in rotation and keeping within a 2 year framework of training to be implemented in January 2014 only. Motion #14 Martin/Catanzaro Adopted.

2013 Program Annual Report Data:

It was moved to reapprove the PN, ADN and BSN programs through December, 2014. Motion #16 Catanzaro/Hensley Adopted

Scholarship: There will be four scholarships in the amount of \$1000.00 each given as in previous years. The Education Committee by consensus agreed to keep the same essay topic "Unique Contribution to Nursing to Healthcare" as in previous years.

NCLEX: Process for ADN and BSN graduates who elect to test as LPN within two years of graduation.

It was moved to require a scope of practice paper for those RN program (BSN/ADN degrees) graduates (within two years of graduation) who elect to take the LPN exam. Motion #17 Bonnel/Catanzaro Adopted.

Legislative Review:

It was moved to approve K.A.R. 65-1119, 60-1-102, 60-1-103, 60-1-104, 60-2-107, 60-17-102, 60-17-103, 60-17-106, 60-17-107, 60-17-108, 60-17-109 and 60-6-101 language for five years as currently stated to begin immediately upon approval. Motion #18 Martin/Catanzaro Adopted.
