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## New Advance Practice Statutes Effective January 1, 2012

In 2003, the National Council State Board of Nursing Advance Practice Registered Nurse (APRN) committee began a draft APRN vision paper in an attempt to resolve APRN regulatory concerns. Their purpose was to provide direction to boards of nursing regarding APRN regulation. During this time the Advanced Practice Nurse (APN) Consensus Group (which was composed of designees from 23 organizations was working to develop consensus on the issues surrounding APRNs. In 2006, the NCSBN APRN committee met with the APRN Consensus Work Group to discuss the NCSBN draft vision paper. Both groups agreed to continue to dialogue and they continued their work on their respective vision papers. A subcommittee (APRN Joint Dialogue Group) was established with 7 members of each group. It was determined that instead of two papers, one joint paper would be developed.

The Consensus Model defines APRN practice, describes the APRN regulatory model, identifies the titles to be used, defines specialty, describes the emergence of new roles and population foci, and presents strategies for implementation. The Consensus Model was discussed at the Delegate Assemble of NCSBN in the summer of 2008. After discussion, the model was adopted by the representatives of the state boards of nursing from across the country.

The Kansas State Board of Nursing was invited to work with representatives of several nursing organizations in Kansas. Three members of the Board of Nursing and staff attended the meetings during the discussion and development of possible legislative change. This group reviewed the consensus model and it was referred to during the process. The ARNP bill was introduced by KSBN and was titled SB 134. The bill passed the Senate and was referred to the House Committee

on Health and Human Services. It passed that committee and was then passed by the House of Representatives as amended in Committee and on the floor. Due to amendments, it was referred to a conference committee. In the conference committee the bill was gutted and the language was placed in HB 2182 along with 11 other health care bills. HB 2182 was then passed by both chambers and signed by Governor Brownback.

There are six proposed changes requested in this bill which are consistent with the Consensus Model.

1. Title change from Advance Registered Nurse Practitioner (ARNP) to Advance Practice Registered Nurse (APRN). By changing the title, it will establish uniformity with other states in the nation and will be less confusing to APRNs who come to Kansas for licensure.
2. Change certificate of qualification to licensure. Certification is granted to an APRN by an accrediting agency when they have completed specialty education. KSBN licenses LPN, RN, and LMHT so this would provide consistency in our process. Also, licensure is one of the four essential elements of the Consensus Model.
3. Changes categories of APRN to roles. The roles will continue to be the same as currently in statute. Those four roles are: Clinical Nurse Specialist, Nurse Anesthetist, Nurse Midwife, and Nurse Practitioner.
4. Require a Masters or higher degree in an APRN roll. This change in the statute will align Kansas with other states in the nation. All APRN programs in Kansas confer a Master degree upon graduation.
5. Continuing education in the APRN role. Presently ARNP are only required to have continuing nursing education hours every two years in the RN role. Although APRNs usually

obtain the hours in the advanced role, this will now require them to receive advance practice continuing nursing education.

6. Any ARNP who is registered to practice prior to the effect date of this bill will be deemed to be licensed to practice as an APRN without being required to file an original application for licensure to remain in practice.

These changes will become effective on **January 1, 2012**. The Board of Nursing ARNP Committee is in the process of updating the ARNP regulations to incorporate the changes and to determine the number of continue nursing education hours needed for renewal. Continue to watch the web page, newsletter, and board packet for further updates.

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# Frequently Asked Questions Now Updated!!!

KSBN has recently completed updates to our Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ's) on our website. Below is a sampling of some FAQ's which are located under the Renewal questions section. A selection of questions will be printed in future editions of this newsletter. Please refer to our newly updated FAQ's for answers to your questions.

**Q: Can I submit my IOA form with my paper application or after I renew online?**

A: No. All CNE must be completed and approved prior to submitting your renewal. Once you receive your approved IOA form, you may complete your online or paper renewal application.

**Q: I want to place my license on Inactive status. How do I do that?**

A: You may only place your LMHT, LPN, or RN license on "Inactive" status by submitting a paper "License Renewal Application" completed according to the special instructions for an "Inactive" license. ARNP licenses may not be placed on "Inactive" status.

**Q: After renewal, when will I get my license card?**

A: As of July 1, 2010 we discontinued printing license cards for license renewals. You may go to "Check Status of Application" to review your expiration date and other aspects of your license.

**Q: How long do I have to renew my license after I let it lapse?**

A: You may only "Renew" an "Active" license. You may "Reinstate" your license up to five years after you have held an active without having to complete a refresher course.

**Q: How can I find out what date my license was reinstated?**

A: Submit an "Information Request" form found in the "Forms" section of our website. List specifically what information you need and mail the form to our office. A fee may be applied.

**Q: How do I renew my Inactive status?**

A: Prior to your expiration date, print the License Renewal Application from the Forms section of our website. Send in completed application with the \$10.00 fee. You will NOT receive a license card and you will need to renew your Inactive status again in two years.

**Q: How do I renew my Exempt status?**

A: Prior to your expiration date, print the License Renewal Application from the Forms section of our website. Send in completed application with the \$50.00 fee. You will NOT receive a license card and you will need to renew your Exempt status again in two years.

**Q: I received my Notice of Renewal Application for my RN but not my ARNP.**

A: Notice of Renewal Applications are only mailed out for LMHT, LPN, & RN licenses. The advance practice licenses will be renewed automatically with the RN license.

**Q: Since the Notice of Renewal Application does not include the fee, how can I find cost of renewal?**

A: Access the KSBN website.

**Q: This is the first time I renewed online. What is my UserID and Password?**

A: You must create a UserID and Password. Click Register a Person and follow online instructions.

**Q: I was trying to renew my license online but the system says I am "not found."**

A: Make sure you enter your last name correctly. Also make sure you enter your date of birth and social security number as the examples show. If you continue to be unable to renew your license, please contact KSBN at 785-296-4929.

**Q: When can I renew my license?**

A: Within 90 days prior to expiration date.

**Q: I want to renew both my RN and ARNP online but the system only allows me to renew the RN?**

A: Your ARNP license is automatically renewed with your RN license.

**Q: I was renewing online and got to the screen where it lists my license(s), but it won't let me go any further.**

A: On the "Application for License Renewal" screen, you must click on the word "Continue" within the profession you are trying to renew.

**Q: I was just issued an ARNP license that doesn't expire for another two years. Can I renew my RN online?**

A: Because the ARNP is tied in with the RN license you should print out the paper "License Renewal Application" and mail it in to get your RN and ARNP expiration dates in sync with each other.

**Q: I wanted to renew online but I got a message that your site is not secure and I should not proceed.**

A: Some browsers do not recognize the encrypted security certificate. This is the same site used by all state agencies for various business transactions. You have the option to file a paper renewal.

**Q: How do I know if I am required to have CNE for my renewal?**

A: If it has been over 30 months since passing the NCLEX or over 9 months since receiving licensure by endorsement or reinstatement, 30 hours of CNE will be required.

**Q: I was renewing online but it won't take my payment?**

A: Some browsers can not read our java script and therefore can not process your payment. You may renew by using a different browser or completing a paper renewal.

**Q: My payment was accepted but my expiration date is unchanged.**

A: When you renew online there may be some processing that will take place. Unresolved issues may delay the licensing process. Keep checking your expiration date online.

**Q: After renewal, when will I get my license card?**

A: As of July 1, 2010 we discontinued printing license cards for license renewals. You may go to "Check Status of Application" to review your expiration date and other aspects of your license.

**Q: I meant to renew my license last month but I did not get it completed. How can I renew now since the system won't let me renew online?**

A: You must now complete a paper reinstatement application.

**Q: Once I Renew online how long do I have to complete my CNE?**

A: Your 30 hours of approved CNE must be completed PRIOR to submitting your application.

**Q: What is meant by approved CNE?**

A: CNE providers approved by any state Board of Nursing or any nationally recognized Nursing organization such as ANCC or AANA or a course approved through the individual offering approval (IOA) process.

**Q: My license expired at the end of last month, what should I do?**

A: Print and complete the Reinstatement Application from the Forms section at [www.ksbn.org](http://www.ksbn.org).

**Q: I went to Check Status of Application and noticed a License Number assigned to me. When will I get my card?**

A: License cards for new licensees are printed at least weekly.

**Q: I just got my license card but there is no expiration date on the card. When does my license expire?**

A: The expiration date shall be the last day of the month in which the licensee's birthday occurs and will be an odd or even year depending on which year you were born in. A license expires every two years. Refer to our License Verification Database at [www.ksbn.org](http://www.ksbn.org) to see when your license expires.

**Q: How do I answer the question about CNE if I am renewing my license for the first time after passing the NCLEX exam?**

A: If it has been less than 30 months since passing the NCLEX exam, you are not required to obtain

CNE. You should answer no. If it has been more than 30 months and you have completed approved CNE you should answer yes.

**Q: What happens if I renew and have not obtained 30 hours of approved CNE?**  
 A: You may be disciplined.

**Q: What proof do I need that I completed my CNE?**

A: Original certificates of completion from approved providers. Certificates must contain a provider ID number from a recognized Nursing CNE provider. Examples of acceptable providers are KSBN IOA form; CNE providers approved by any state Board of Nursing or any nationally recognized Nursing organization such as ANCC or AANA.

**Q: When do I need to apply for individual offering approval (IOA form)?**

A: Any course not approved by a recognized CNE provider must go through the individual offering approval process. This would include all college courses and all courses provided by other health care providers.

**Q: Can I submit my IOA form after I renew online or with my paper application?**

A: No. All CNE's must be completed and approved prior to your renewal. Once you receive your approved IOA form you may complete your online or paper renewal application.

**Q: Do I still have to list/enter my CNE?**

A: No. Please retain your certificates in the event you are selected for an audit. If you are audited you must submit original certificates.

**Q: How many Continuing Nursing Education hours do I need to renew?**

A: 30 approved Continuing Nursing Education hours are required every 2 years. You must have completed your CNE before submitting the renewal application.

**Q: Do you provide a list of approved Continuing Nursing Education?**

A: No, KSBN does not provide a list. Some courses can be found in the KSBN Nursing newsletter.

**Q: How do I know the Continuing Nursing Education I completed is approved?**

A: Check the accreditation and/or approval on all courses that you complete. KSBN will only accept Continuing Nursing Education that is approved or accredited by Nursing providers. Examples of acceptable providers are KSBN IOA form; CNE providers approved by any state Board of Nursing or any nationally recognized Nursing organization such as ANCC or AANA.

**Q: Do college classes count for Continuing Nursing Education?**

A: Not all college courses count for Continuing Nursing Education. College courses in science, psychology, sociology, or statistics that are prerequisites for a nursing degree may qualify. If you would like to use your college courses for Continuing Nursing Education credit you must complete the Individual Offering of Approval (IOA) form. This process must be completed PRIOR to using a college course for renewal or reinstatement.

**Q: I have acquired many Continuing Nursing Education hours that are less than 1 contact hour. Can I use those for Continuing Education hours?**

A: No. KSBN will not accept Continuing Nursing Education that is less than 1 contact hour.

**Q: Can I use my CMEs for Continued Nursing Education?**

A: CME's are Continuing Medical Education (CME) and not Continuing Nursing Education (CNE). These may only be used if the course is submitted for approval on the Individual Offering of Approval (IOA) form.

**Q: Can I fax Individual Offering Approval?**

A: No, you must mail the original IOA form along with a self addressed stamped envelope and other items as noted in the instructions for completing the IOA form.

**Q: Some certificates give credit in CEU's. What's a CEU?**

A: One CEU (continuing education unit) = 10 contact hours. One contact hour is equal to 50 clock minutes. One contact hour is accepted by KSBN as 1 CNE hour.

**Q: Why do I need a Temporary Permit?**

A: If you DO NOT have your 30 hours of continuing nursing education you can apply for a temporary permit which will allow you 120 days to meet the requirements. You are allowed to work with the Temporary Permit as long as long as it is active.

**Q: Will I receive a Temporary Permit?**

A: Yes, when requested on the application with appropriate fee, unless you have disqualifying factors. The granting of Temporary Permits is discretionary.

**Q: Will the CNE provider send my 30 hours to KSBN?**

A: No, you are responsible for submitting your original certificates to KSBN.

**Q: What is meant by approved CNE?**

A: CNE providers approved by any state Board of Nursing or any nationally recognized Nursing organization such as ANCC or AANA or a course approved through the individual offering approval (IOA) process.

**Q: My license lapsed more than 5 years ago, what should I do to reinstate it?**

A: Any applicant whose Kansas license has lapsed for more than five years beyond its expiration date may reinstate the license by submitting evidence of:

- Current licensure in another jurisdiction which requires completion of a number of contact hours of continuing nursing education for license renewal which are equivalent to or greater than the number of hours required in Kansas or
- Licensure in another jurisdiction sometime during the preceding five-year period, and completion of 30 contact hours of approved continuing nursing education within the preceding two-year period or
- Satisfactory completion of a refresher course approved by the board

**Q: What is the scope of practice for an LPN?**

A: K.S.A. 1113(d)(2) sets three qualifiers for LPN practice: 1) an LPN must have a supervisor that is an RN, someone licensed to practice medicine and surgery (M.D. or D.O.) or a dentist; 2) an LPN must function in the area of supportive and/or restorative care; 3) an LPN's activities must be based on acceptable

educational preparation. If these three criteria are met an LPN may engage in care, nursing diagnosis, treatment, counsel and health teaching, supervision, administration, teaching of the nursing process and execution of the medical regimen. These activities are most often limited by the LPN's educational preparation. Any post basic education obtained can be considered and should meet the industry standard.

**Q. Can an unlicensed person call themselves a nurse?**

A. No. K.S.A. 65-1114 makes it unlawful for any individual to practice as, hold oneself out as, use any sign/card/device or words to the effect they are licensed as an RN, LPN or ARNP unless they are duly licensed or authorized. K.S.A. 65-1122 imposes a criminal penalty for such actions.

**Q. Can an unlicensed person practice nursing?**

A. No. The general rule of law (K.S.A. 65-1114) says they cannot. See above answer. There are some exceptions to this answer and they are found at K.S.A. 65-1124. They include but are not limited to; gratuitous nursing by friends or family, domestic servants, unlicensed people who have had a nursing action delegated to them by a nurse, etc.

**Q. What is acceptable educational preparation?**

A. It is the education level and content most common to all individuals that perform the same activity. Example; a phlebotomist receives basic education on anatomy, tube selection for tests required, blood drawing procedure. An LPN or RN would have to know/learn the same information. The level of education required is not set by statute or regulation but is industry driven. Look to see what most facilities or liability carriers require.

**Q. Can an employer narrow a nurses scope of practice and is a nurse bound by that?**

A. Yes. Even though the legislature and Board through statutes and regulations set a wide scope of practice for nurses, an employer can choose what they will and won't allow a nurse to do. A nurse is bound by the facility policy and procedure. K.S.A. 65-1120(a) (6) unprofessional conduct is a ground for discipline of a nurses license. At K.A.R. 60-3-110(c) unprofessional conduct is defined as failing to follow policies and procedures in the practice situation designed to safeguard the patient. You must know and follow your facility policy and procedures unless you believe it is clearly substandard.



## Approval of Continuing Education

In order to receive credit for continuing education each presentation or provider must be approved by the Board. Many presenters have been pre-approved by the Board and their presentations will be accepted. Approved presenters have a number on their certificates of attendance such as: "SP1111-1234" or "LT0555-1234." If the provider has not received pre-approval for their presentation, it will be necessary for the licensee to fill out and return an IOA (Individual Offering Approval) form.

A note of caution concerning IOAs...**When license renewal is done using CNE which needs an IOA, the IOA must be approved by the Board BEFORE renewing the license.** An IOA form must be completed for those offerings attended that have not been approved for continuing nursing credit by a national nursing organization or a state board of nursing.

The offering objectives and agenda MUST be sent with the IOA form to receive credit. A copy of the certificate or verification of attendance must be attached, with a Self Addressed Stamped Envelope (SASE)

If the IOA is not approved prior to license renewal, it cannot count towards the 30 hours and your license renewal may be placed in jeopardy.

### What is KNAP?

KNAP is a professional assistance program designed to assist all nurses and mental health technicians who have a problem or illness that has or could impair their ability to practice safely.

### The Goal of KNAP

Mental and physical illness, including alcohol and other drug addiction, can potentially impair practice and health. We estimate that at any given time, approximately 10% of the population is affected. This same percentage is thought to be true of healthcare professionals.

Alcohol and other drug addiction, as well as mental and physical illnesses, are treatable. KNAP works with the program participants to obtain an evaluation, treatment (if indicated), and monitoring throughout the recovery process.

### Referrals

Self-referrals to the program are encouraged, but referrals may be made by a family member, a friend, employer or anyone concerned about the nurse/LMHT.

Anonymous referrals are not accepted. A person may call for information or advice without giving their name, however. Referrals may be made by calling 913-236-7575.

### KNAP Providers

- Confidential services to Kansas RNs, LPNs, and LMHTs experiencing problems and illnesses which could lead to impaired practice.
- Interventions, assessments, referrals for evaluation and treatment (if indicated.)
- On-going monitoring through random urine drug screens, contact with employers and monthly groups.

### Causes for Concern

#### Job Function

- Narcotics discrepancies, e.g.: incorrect counts, alteration of narcotic containers, increased patient reports of ineffective pain control, discrepancies on records or frequent corrections of records, unusual amounts of narcotics wasted, significant variations in the quantity of narcotics ordered for technician's unit or shift.

- Fluctuations in the quality of work performance.
- Irresponsible behavior from someone previously conscientious and responsible.
- Requests to work shifts that are the least supervised.
- Inordinate interest in patients' pain control medications.

#### Behavior

- Increasing isolation from colleagues, friends and family and avoiding social activities.
- Complaints from others about work performance or alcohol or drug use.
- Mood swings, irritability or depression, or suicide threats or attempts, perhaps caused by accidental overdose.

#### Physical Symptoms

- Obvious intoxication such as swaying, staggering or slurred speech.
- Odor of alcohol on breath or the excessive use of breath-fresheners or perfume to disguise the odor of alcohol.

## March Finance Committee

The March Finance Committee was called to order March 30, 2011 at 8:30 a.m. in room 108 of the Landon State Office Building in Topeka by Bernard Becker, Vice Chair. The agenda was amended to move the discussion about fees to the June finance committee. The minutes from the December 5, 2010 meeting were approved.

M. Blubaugh reported that the FY11 budget was going to be about \$48,000 short and that she has asked for a Governor Budget Adjustment (GBA). She reported that the appropriation bill for the agency had passed through the House Appropriations Committee and the Senate Ways and Means Committee. In the FY 12 and 13 budgets, the Governor had recommended that three open positions be eliminated and had reduced the appropriation level as requested by the agency. The committees recommended that the three positions not be eliminated and approved the appropriation level requested by the agency. Neither chamber has taken action on the KSBN budget at the time of the committee meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:15 a.m.

## March 2011 Education Committee

The Education Committee met March 29, 2011 and was called to order by Mary Carol Pomatto, Chairperson, at 8:35 a.m. in Room 106 of the Landon State Office Building. The Committee reviewed the onsite packet and approved the additions and revisions to the agenda. The minutes from December 14, 2010 were approved. The Education Specialist report was given by Carol Moreland.

National American University – Wichita West Education location had a site visit on February 23, 2011 for initial program approval. It was moved to accept the site visit report for initial approval to admit 24 students for the BSN Clinical Core annually starting Fall 2011 and initial admission for the LPN Bridge for articulation to BSN Clinical Core to begin Summer 2011.

The following schools presented major curriculum changes:

- University of Kansas
- Barton County Community College
- University of St. Mary
- Emporia State University
- North Central Kansas Technical College – Hays Campus
- Pratt Community College

All requested changes were approved.

The 2010 NCLEX RN & PN pass rates were reviewed and discussed. Revisions of Educational Forms on KSBN website were reviewed. LPN Refresher Courses from Innovative Academic Solutions and Greenville Technical College were presented and both approved.

Eleven petitions for permission to test/retest were reviewed and action taken.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:10 pm.

## Licensee Non-Response To Investigative Committee Request/Offer

**Purpose:** Upon completion of an investigation the Investigative Committee (or its designee) reviews and directs a disposition for the case. With the exception of cases directed straight to the Attorney General, the investigator then writes to the licensee at the address on file delivering the request of the committee and asking for a written response. If the licensee does not respond it is important for the case to move timely through the administrative process.

**Policy:** The following steps will be taken in processing these cases.

1. After the Investigative Committee or its designee directs a disposition the investigator will write a letter to the licensee memorializing the committee's request.
2. The investigator will use the current address (provided by the licensee) noted in the licensing system.
3. The investigator will request a written response from the licensee and will give the licensee either 14 calendar days in which to respond.
4. If the licensee responds and agrees to the disposition the investigator needs to process the case according to the agreement. If the licensee responds and does not choose the disposition then the investigator needs to process the case accordingly.
5. If the licensee does not respond, within the stated time frame the investigator may process the file on to the Attorney General for further review and action.

## Fingerprinting by Appointment

Fingerprinting for background checks may now be processed using an electronic system at the KSBN office. Walk-in printing may be done but due to equipment and staffing limitations it is highly suggested that an appointment be made for having your fingerprints taken. There are occasions when all of the equipment will be in use out of the office. By calling ahead and scheduling an appointment you may eliminate frustration occurring from driving to the office then being rerouted to our local KBI office.

Fingerprints will only be taken if an application has been received. The fee for having your fingerprints done in our office is \$7.50 which may be included in the same check/money order as the \$50.00 background fee. If you are delivering an application at the same time, the application fee may be included in the same check/money order. Cash is accepted in our office for the exact amount; we do not have the ability to make change. Appointments for walk in printing will not be accepted after 3:30 pm. The advanced practice committee considered programs from several out-of-state colleges at the March 2011 meeting. The following programs were approved: Indiana Wesleyan: Primary Care NP; University of Maryland, Baltimore: Trauma NP and Critical NP, Acute Care NP & CNS; St. Louis University: Acute Care NP and Gerontological NP; New York University - Broadway: Adult Acute NP, Adult NP, Geriatrics NP, Mental Health NP, Pediatrics NP, and Nurse Midwife; Emory University: Acute Care NP, Adult NP, Family NP, Women's Health NP, Pediatrics NP, Midwife; University of North Dakota: RNA; University of Illinois - Chicago: Women's Health NP.

# False/Inaccurate Application Information Board Policy On Agreements

**Purpose:** Providing inaccurate or false information on agency records is a violation of the Kansas Nurse Practice Act (KNPA). Applicants who answer licensing application questions inaccurately or untruthfully are guilty of this behavior. Filing of subsequent applications and not revealing information already known to the agency and the licensee are continued violations of the KNPA. All application information/answers are submitted under penalty of perjury. The Board has established this agreement format allowing for education and fine payments to dispose of these types of cases in an expeditious manner for the agency and the licensees/applicants while still addressing the unlawful behavior. Cases that involve additional types of violations will be handled and presented individually for disposition direction.

**Policy:** The following criteria will be applied to the processing of applications providing inaccurate or untruthful information.

(1) First Offenses

(a) Renewals. The first time an applicant provides false or inaccurate information on a renewal licensing application they will be requested in writing by staff to complete an education class on the KNPA. A time frame of 14 calendar days will be given to the applicant for written response to the request. If the applicant agrees to the education a date of completion will be documented by a letter, notes will be placed in MYLO and the case will be monitored for completion of that education class. The applicant also receives notification in the letter of the required information to be submitted on future applications as well as the need to file future expungement information with the agency. These agreed cases will be noted on a spread sheet that will be presented to the Investigative Committee at each Board meeting for the committees review and acknowledgement. For renewal applications a license may be issued regardless of whether the licensee selects the education option. If the applicant does not select the education option the case will be processed on for final direction or disposition by the Investigative Committee Chairperson or the Investigative Committee.

(b) Graduates/Endorsements/Reinstatements. If the applicant is a graduate, endorsement or reinstatement application the Investigative Committee Chairperson or Committee should review the case before the education option is offered. No license or permit should be given until direction is received from the Chairperson or the Committee. If a licensee is offered and selects the education option a date of completion will be documented by a letter, notes will be placed in MYLO and the case will be monitored for completion of that education class. The applicant also receives notification in the letter of the required information to be submitted on future applications as well as the need to file future expungement information with the agency. The Investigative Committee reserves the right to direct other dispositions based on individual review of all facts and circumstances.

(2) Second Offenses.

Based upon the filing of the renewal application the license may be issued. The second time a licensee fails to provide information on an application the staff will offer the applicant an agreement to pay a fine of \$200.00. As with fines for unlicensed practice that money will be deposited to the State of Kansas general fund and will not benefit the Board of Nursing in any way. Upon payment of the fine the licensee's name will also be printed in the KSBN newsletter. The listing shall contain the name, license number, city of residence. These cases will be noted on a spread sheet that will be presented to the Investigative Committee at each Board meeting for the committees review and acknowledgement. If the fine option is not selected the case will be processed for disposition by the Investigative Chairperson or the Investigative Committee.

(3) Third and Subsequent Offenses.

Further incidents of failing to note information on applications will be processed for direction/disposition by the Investigative Committee.

## Process For Renewals When CNE Requirements Not Met Non Qualification

**Purpose:** Filing a renewal and not having completed 30 hours of CNE is a violation of the Kansas Nurse Practice Act (KNPA). All application information/answers are submitted under penalty of perjury. Applicants who answer the licensing application questions inaccurately or untruthfully are guilty of providing false information, fraud in procuring the license and also violating any provision of the KNPA specifically KSA 65-1117 which requires 30 hours of CNE to qualify for renewal of a license. Licensees who answer truthfully to having no CNE are guilty of violating the KNPA for the reason of non qualification under KSA 65-1117. The Board has established the following process for handling these issues in an expeditious manner for the agency and the licensees/applicants while still addressing the unlawful behavior. Cases that involve additional types of violations will be handled and presented individually for disposition direction.

**Policy:** The following criteria will be applied to the processing of applications that are non-qualified for renewal.

- (1) Truthful answer and less than 30 hours of CNE obtained.

Staff will complete an investigation and document the failure to obtain CNE as required. The Assistant Attorney General will review the documentation and issue a summary order that revokes the license that was obtained based upon the non-qualification. A letter and a reinstatement application with instructions will accompany the summary order that is mailed to the licensee. The letter will instruct the licensee not to practice between the effective date of the summary order and the granting of the reinstatement license. No temporary permit will be granted to complete the reinstatement process. When the reinstatement application, appropriate fee and the required 30 hours

of CNE are received the license should be granted. The revocation and reinstatement if obtained will be reported as required by Federal law and will be listed in the newsletter along with all other administrative actions taken by the Board.

- (2) Untruthful answer and less than 30 hours of CNE obtained.

Staff will complete an investigation and document the failure to obtain CNE as required and the untruthful answer. The Assistant Attorney General will review the documentation and issue a summary order that revokes the license that was obtained based upon the non-qualification and will require the licensee upon filing of a reinstatement application to submit in addition to the required 30 hours of CNE additional CNE on the KNPA. The additional CNE on the KNPA will be CNE hours not to be counted as part of the regular 30 hours required for reinstatement. A letter and a reinstatement application with instructions will accompany the summary order that is mailed to the licensee. The letter will instruct the licensee not to practice between the effective date of the summary order and the granting of the reinstatement license. No temporary permit will be granted to complete the reinstatement process. When the reinstatement application, appropriate fee and the required 30 hours of CNE are received the license should be granted. The revocation and reinstatement if obtained will be reported as required by Federal law and will be listed in the newsletter along with all other administrative actions taken by the Board.

## Check The Status Of Your Application On Line!

With the implementation of new software, KSBN has added a new service available to their applicants and licensees. We are proud to announce that nurses may now check the status of their application at any time. The service is available 24 hour a day—7 days a week. If you have a new application, or have renewed or reinstated your license, you may check to see the status of that application by logging in to [www.ksbn.org](http://www.ksbn.org) and click on “Check Status of Application.” Simply enter your UserID and Password, or register so you will have a UserID and Password. To check the status of your application click on “view checklist” for each license you are applying for or renewing (see examples below). The licensure requirements will display showing what has been completed and what is outstanding. The outstanding items are marked **unchecked**. Items that have been received will be marked completed. Watch the newsletter for new services announced in the future.

# Wallet Cards Will No Longer Be Issued For Previous Licensees!

Starting July 1, 2010 you will no longer receive the usual wallet card (“license”) that you are accustomed to receiving. The Board of Nursing voted at the December 2009 meeting to discontinue issuing a wallet card on license renewal or reinstatement. The change in procedure was made for public protection and also as a fiscal savings due to the decrease of budget the board has been required to take in FY 09 and FY10. It is estimated that \$16,000 will be saved yearly with this change.


Certificates and license cards **will only be printed with initial licensure**. The certificate and card will indicate that you have been approved for licensure in Kansas as a registered professional nurse, a licensed practical nurse, an advanced registered nurse practitioner, or a licensed mental health technician. These documents will have your name, address and license number. There will **NOT** be a date of expiration on your certificate. The current status of your license (whether active, inactive, lapsed, suspended, etc.) is available online at the Board’s website: <http://www.ksbn.org>. **The web site will also show the date your license expires.** For employers to verify the status of the license, employers will go online (just as they have done). It is important that the nurse verifies that their license has been renewed. You can do that by going to [www.ksbn.org](http://www.ksbn.org) and click on license renewals. Log into the system and insert your UserID and Password. The list of licenses that you hold will be displayed under your personal information. It will contain your license number, status, issue date, and expiration date (see examples).

There will be no process change on notification of renewal as you will continue to receive notice that your license is due for renewal just as you do now. KSBN will continue to mail the notice approximately 90 days prior of your license expiration. If you were born in an odd year (example 1975) you will receive the notice in an odd year (example 2011). If you were born in an even year (example 1978) you will receive your notice in an even year (2012). For example, if your birth month is September 1975, the postcard is mailed the first week of July 2011. If your birth month is October 1978, the postcards are mailed the first week of August 2012.

You may ALWAYS renew online within 90 days of the end of your birth month in the year that you are due to renew. It would be a good practice to check your nursing license EVERY year on your birthday to make sure that the license does not lapse. This is particularly a good habit in case you forget to notify the Board that you have moved, and the post office is no longer forwarding your mail. If you move you are required to notify the board within 30 days of your new address. You may notify the board by going on line and changing your address. This service is available 24 hours a day-7 days a week.


